FAITH 104: SESSION SEVEN

FAITH TAKES THE TOIL OUT-PART 3

Acts 14:27

(27) And when they (the Jewish believers) were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened **the door of faith** unto the Gentiles.

GOD'S ORIGINAL INTENT

Genesis 1:28-30

(28) **AND GOD BLESSED THEM**, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.

- We are commanded to operate out of *“the deposit of works”* that God seeded into us.
- Once we began to function out of the deposit of works inside of us; no toil, sweat, and strain is no longer required to produce in the earth.
- We have been blessed with *“the blessing”* to bring forth results at a level that represents God.

TOIL DEFINED

Toil is defined as the effort of man to accomplish a thing outside of the blessing [grace and the supernatural might of God].

- To live life outside of the blessing
- To toil is to work harder than is required;
- To sweat, to strive,
- To hustle.

BE CAREFUL FOR NOTHING

Philippians 4:6-7

(6) *Be careful for nothing*; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. (7) And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

- In no thing be full of care (anxiety, worry, overly concerned) – **Matthew 6:25 AMP**
- Employ the peace of God which enables you to operate above natural understanding regarding that situation or circumstance
- The peace of God [coming from His Word] is designed to keep [guard and protect] your spirit-man and your soul-man – **Proverbs 12:25 AMP**
- Care and anxiety is powerless to make anything better. Toil is designed to always make things worse – **Luke 12:25 AMP**

Jeremiah 17:7-8

(7) Blessed is the man that trusteth in the LORD, and whose hope the LORD is. (8) For he shall be as a tree planted by the waters, and that spreadeth out her roots by the river, and shall not see when heat cometh, but her leaf shall be green; *and shall not be careful in the year of drought*, neither shall cease from yielding fruit.

- When the blessing is acquired in one's life, times of shortage and lack are of no concern for the believer.
- The believer is empowered to be a distribution center for those in need during the day of shortage and lack
- When the world's economy is collapsing; the people of God (by way of the blessing) are continuing to yield fruit without toil. – **Psalm 127:2 AMP**

Take No Thought

Matthew 10:18-20

(18) And ye shall be brought before governors and kings for my sake, for a testimony against them and the Gentiles. (19) But when they deliver you up, *take no thought how or what ye shall speak*: for it shall be given you in that same hour what ye shall speak. (20) For it is not ye that speak, but the Spirit of your Father which speaketh in you.

- Take possession of no thought, doubt, or anxiety, **where you defense is concerned**
- Provision is made by the Holy Spirit

Matthew 6:25

(25) Therefore I say unto you, *Take no thought for your life*, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat, and the body than raiment?

- In order for any thought to become a recognized reality; it [the thought] must be taken in and received by the one to whom the thought has come.
- Take possession of no thought, doubt, or anxiety, **where you needs are concerned**
- If I can't see past my needs; I can't live past what I need. Life is so much greater than my little world of needs

FAITH ENCOUNTER

Mary And Martha

Luke 10:38-42

(38) Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house. (39) And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word. (40) But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me. (41) And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things: (42) But one thing is

needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her. **[READ MESSAGE BIBLE]**

- Martha was “cumbered” with much serving or in other words, she was busy, preoccupied with, and toiling with serving Jesus
- Her busyness was a good deed; however it was not designed to meet her need.
- Never confuse busyness with getting results
- Jesus said one thing is needful. The one thing that is needful, Mary has chosen it and it shall add to her life and cannot be taken away.
